



RENTAL POLICIES

SAFETY RULES: Participants are responsible for their own insurance, and, by signing the facility use agreement, waive all right of action against Mount Traber Bible Camp.

CHECK-IN/OUT TIME: We must know your arrival and departure time. If for any reason you are going to be late or need to stay longer please notify us. All belongs must go with you when you depart.

ANIMALS/PETS: Please leave your pets at home. Pets are not allowed on the premises, other than helper animals, which may be allowed to accompany their owners by prior arrangement.

SMOKING, DRUGS, AND ALCOHOL: Use of tobacco products, non-prescription drugs or alcohol is strictly forbidden.

CLEANING: Participants are responsible for leaving the facilities in the same condition in which they were found. This includes the grounds and the rooms. Please put all materials that can be recycled, including cans, glass, plastic bottles and newsprint in the proper containers.

CHAPERONES: Same sex chaperones are required for any participants that are not over 18 years of age.

POOL: By prior arrangement, the pool can be made available if a **certified** lifeguard is provided or arranged as part of the rental agreement. The Lifeguard at the pool will enforce the rules; this will be provided upon arrival, as well as other rules posted at the pool.

FIRE: Wood is provided for use only at the designated fire pit. Please let us know in advance if you would like a campfire. We can arrange to have it made for you or you can start it yourself with permission.

HIKING: The camp is a hilly, wooded area with streams. Caution is necessary to avoid slipping or falling when hiking on trails or roads. Please let MTBC staff know if you plan to go hiking. We have 400 acres to hike on and you can get turned around quickly, so making us aware will give the opportunity to let you know where and where not to go and to be aware of your return.

PARKING: Guests must park in the designated parking area in front of the lodge. **DO NOT** drive on **ANY** grassy areas.

STEWARDSHIP: Mount Traber Bible Camp is committed to preserving the land at the camp as far as possible in its natural condition. Guests are asked to respect all the plant life, animals, soil and water on the premises. This includes taking care to not cut trees, break off limbs, dig up plants, damage trails, or pollute or disturb waterways. Hunting of animals is strictly forbidden. No littering of any kind is permitted.

ADDITIONAL BUILDINGS: There are a number of small storage buildings. You are welcome to use all of the common areas of the grounds. However, the storage buildings are off limits unless otherwise arranged by Mark or Debbie Taylor.
